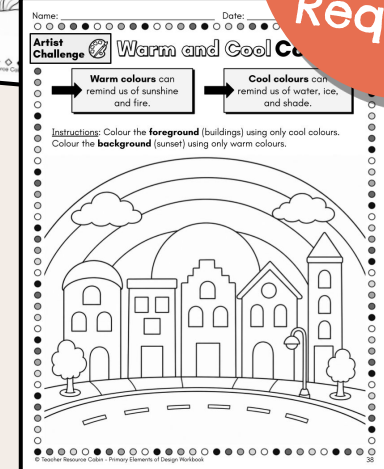
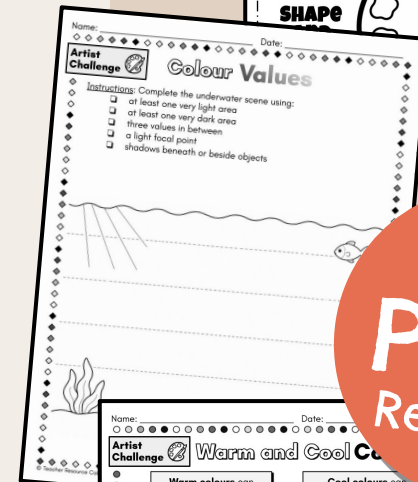
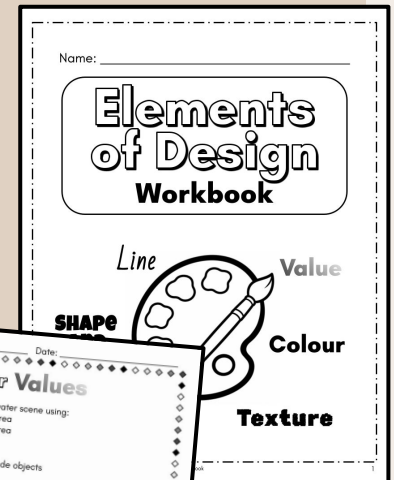
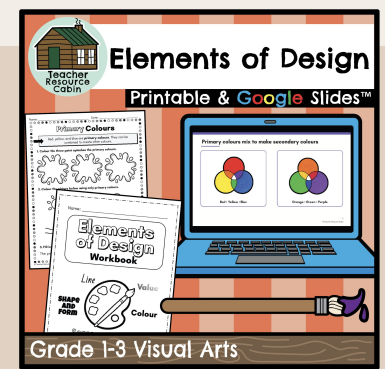
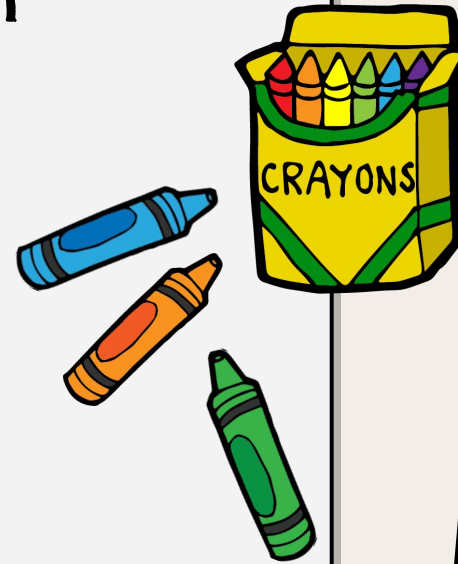


Elements of Design

Artists build pictures with six elements

- Artists combine the elements in many ways.
- One piece of art can use every element.
- We can learn to notice and control each one.

Line Lines can be straight, curved, thick, thin, or broken.	SHAPE AND FORM Shapes are flat, while forms look solid and three-dimensional. They can be geometric or organic.	Space Space is the area around, between, inside, or behind objects. Artists use size, placement, and overlapping to allow depth.
Colour Colour includes the different hues we see and use in art. Artists can use colour to create feelings and moods.	Texture Texture is how something feels or looks like it might feel. Artists use lines and patterns to show texture.	Value Value describes how light or dark something appears. Artists use value to show form, depth, and mood.

LINE

Lines can be straight, curved, thick, thin, or broken. Artists use lines to create shapes, patterns, and movement.

Lines can take many different paths

A line is a mark that moves across a surface.

- straight and curved
- wavy and zigzag
- dotted and dashed
- spiral and scalloped

Instructions: Colour the **foreground** (buildings) using only cool colours. Colour the **background** (sunset) using only warm colours.

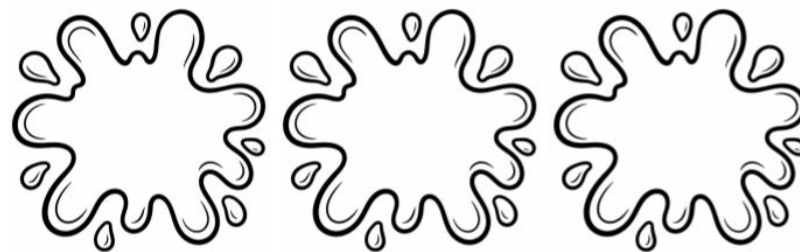

1. Colour the three paint splashes the primary colours.

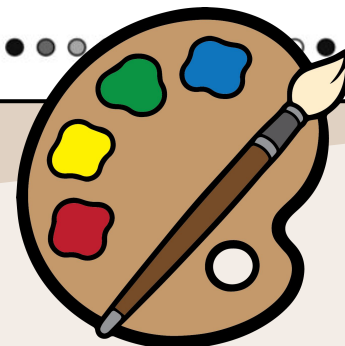
