

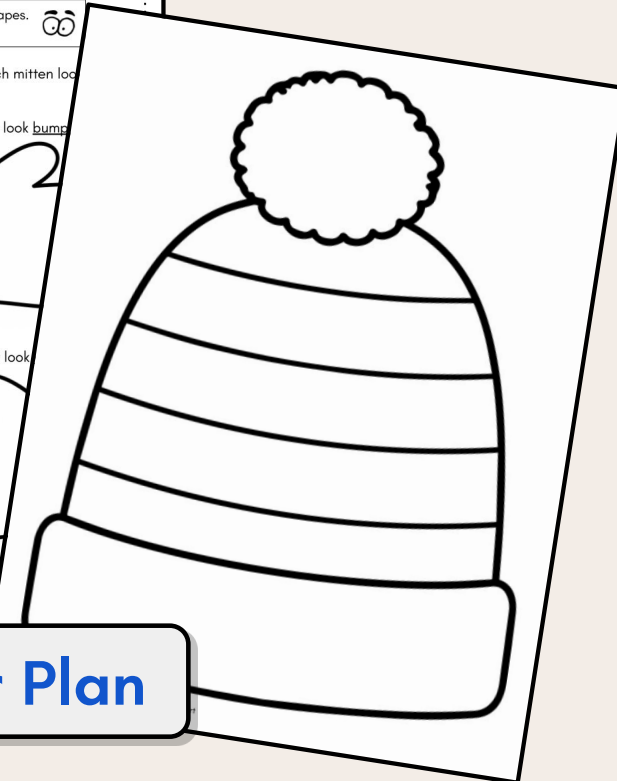
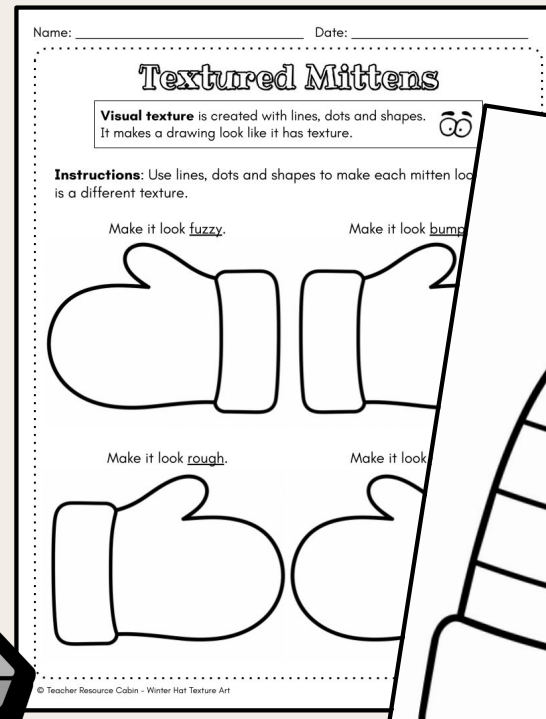

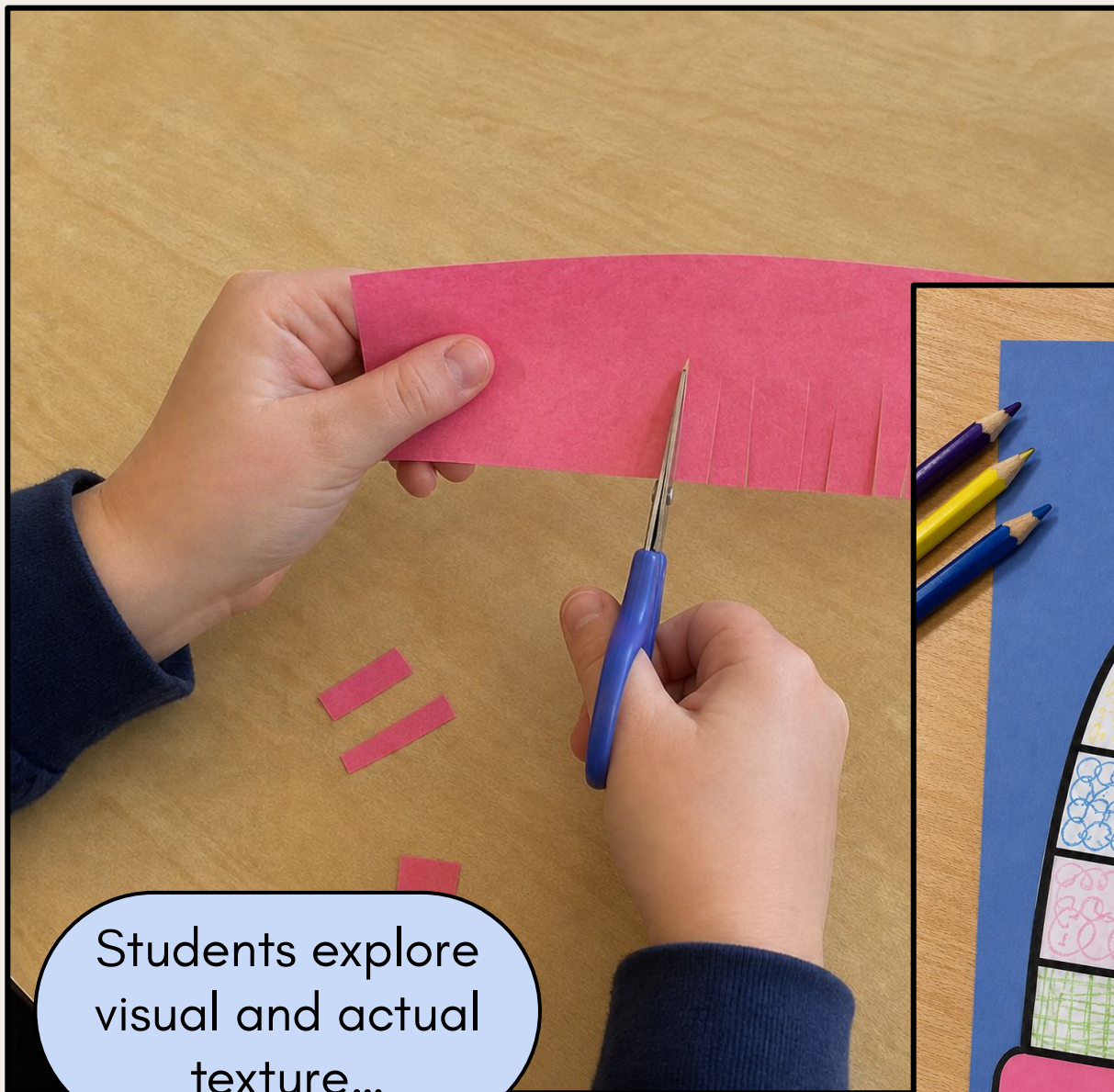
Winter Hat Texture Art Project

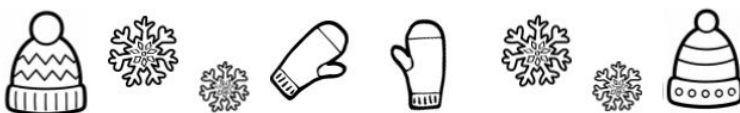
